1. Chairman	Not present
2. Treasurers	Read by The Treasurer The Balance sheet was handed out – Cllr Parker asked why the income from the Allotment Association was high – It was 2 years. The accounts were accepted as a true record
3. District Councilor	Due to the recent District elections Nathan Hull was no longer our Councilor and Cllr Margaret Atkinson had a prior engagement. Clint cum Hamlets is now in the area of Fountains and Ripley.
4. County Councilor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Following a request from a resident re No Cold Calling Zone, Cllr Harrison reported that the Trading Standards within the County Council were looking into this and will report back to the Parish Council when further information available. • Further rollout of Super fast Broadband – The County Council had updated over the last 5 years and now Phase 3 is being rolled out, a 3 year project and information would be forwarded when further information available. • School Closure – No papers have been published and a decision was to be made later this month, but not looking good.
Items for discussion	Cllr Harper opened the floor to the residents
1. Cricket Club Rent	A Resident reported that he had seen grass cuttings being put over the wall into fields. Clerk to send letter to Ground care to ask them not to do this.
2. Rent	A Resident asked why a difference between organisations rent. It was said that the rent from the Allotments went towards the cost of the grass cutting. As agreed in a previous meeting the allotments have had their rents reduced to £30 per plot.
